Before tribal officials in Indian Country can effectively address violence, the roots of violence on the Rez must be identified and defined. It is not enough to acknowledge that there are categories of violence: gang violence, domestic violence, school violence, police violence, workplace violence and suicides. Interagency partnerships must be established and strategies must be designed to eliminate violent behavior and bring wellness to Indian communities. This training session examines the entire scope of violence in Indian Country and offers innovative approaches to eliminating violent behavior.
