Opioids in Indian Country: Promoting Treatment & Cultural Interventions December 10-12, 2018

Tribal communities throughout the U.S. are disproportionately impacted by opioids and substance abuse. A National Institute on Drug Abuse survey found that American Indian students' annual heroin and OxyContin use was about two to three times higher than the national averages from 2009 to 2012. This training session will provide information about the Healing to Wellness Program designed to address opioid addiction administered by the Saginaw Chippewa Tribal Court. The mission of the Healing to Wellness Program is to reduce recidivism, family violence, and death caused by substance abuse by leading participants down the Red Road. By embracing cultural teachings of the Seven Grandfathers, and the Medicine Wheel, the healing to Wellness Team provides their clients with a sense of pride and responsibility to themselves, and their Tribal community.
