



TRIBAL BROWNFIELDS GRANT WORKSHOP

TUITION FREE WORKSHOP -

Whether your organization has received funding in the past or is new to the grants process, this workshop will focus on how to competitively apply for federal Brownfields grants that will assist with site assessment and cleanup to move your projects toward your desired redevelopment outcome. These grants may be community-wide or site specific and can cover impacts from hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, controlled substances (clandestine drug labs, etc), petroleum or petroleum products, and abandoned mine lands/mine-scared lands.

These grants may be used to: inventory/characterize/prioritize/assess sites, conduct community involvement activities, cleanup and redevelopment planning, health monitoring, monitoring/enforcement of institutional controls, develop/implement a Brownfield Program, purchase environmental insurance, carry out cleanup activities, oversee cleanup construction activities, environmental monitoring of cleanup work. For example this funding can be utilized to assess and cleanup hazardous waste sites (including clandestine drug lab wastes) along roadsides and adjacent properties because of illegal dumping activities on tribal lands.

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and California Department of Toxic Substances Control staff will present critical information on how to secure Brownfields funding for environmentally impacted properties in your community. Topics to be covered include: *Applicant and Site Eligibility Criteria; Scoring Criteria; Application Steps; and Success Stories.* We will also cover property acquisition requirements to ensure eligibility for Brownfields grants.

We will also discuss how to prepare an application package for the current grant period. Bring your ideas on any potential problems and/or sites on your tribal lands (trust and non) and we will assist you in initiating a grant proposal(s). We will provide examples of past grant applications that have been awarded and a template for the current grant applications.
