  - Northwest to northeast wind gusts between 35 and 50 mph Strongest yesterday afternoon and night, 08/06/18.
  - Gusty southwest interior winds today, 08/07/18.

- Large vertical plume growth possible with hot and unstable conditions in the mountains.

# **WEATHER SYNOPSIS BY REGION**


### NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

  Declaration could bring in grant programs like Individuals and Households Program, Crisis Counseling, Critical
  Needs assistance program, Transitional Sheltering Assistance, Disaster Case Management, Disaster Legal
  Services, USDA/CDSS Calfresh (D-SNAP), Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA), including the State
  Supplemental Grant Program, which is administered through State of California, Department of Social Services
- FEMA will deploy Disaster Survivor Assistance Teams for outreach and assistance in registering people by no later than 8/8/18
- FEMA & Cal OES IA held a conference call with Shasta County Housing director and staff to discuss the FEMA IA
  registration process and programs that are available.

### **Local Assistance Centers**

- IA is encouraging partners to ensure information and services are accessible to all clients who come into the LAC, including those with language and other access and functional needs. The LAC has language support services available in Arabic, Cantonese, Mandarin, Farsi, French, ASL, and Spanish
- Cal OES, SBA and County are in discussion on details for the upcoming Disaster Response Center(s). FEMA has
  identified a potential sight for DRC that will open no later than 8/9/18
